Job summary:

Armada Family Practice have an exciting opportunity for an enthusiastic and motivated Paramedic or ANP to join our friendly and supportive practice team for 16 hours per week.

We are seeking an experienced Paramedic or Advanced Nurse Practitioner with an interest in frailty to join our multidisciplinary clinical team who can work effectively and autonomously to undertake patient assessment, diagnosis and clinical management of patients within a care home setting.

Main duties of the job:

You will be working to support our Partners and Salaried GPs to deliver a high standard of patient care as an Advanced Practitioner in general practice. Using advanced autonomous clinical skills and a broad in-depth theoretical knowledge within the scope of practice of the post, the post holder will be able to assess and treat both acute and chronic diseases in a care home setting. The post holder will undertake a weekly ward round at each of our care homes, assessing new residents and acute/chronic problems discussing patients with the practice team to ensure ongoing care needs are addressed. Liaising with patients and their family as needed and ensuring completion of care plans.

About us:

The Armada Family Practice works from a modern purpose-built health centre with a practice population of circa 16,300 patients.

Job description:

The post holder will provide holistic health care for a wide range of health needs in a primary care setting, including undifferentiated and undiagnosed problems using advanced clinical skills.

- Will act autonomously within their professional boundaries providing clinical care to patients
- Complete a weekly ward round for each care home
- Will be the main practice contact for care homes
- Will ensure completion of patient care plans.
- Ensure completion of the PCN DES requirements
- Provide information needed to assist with medication reviews
- Will demonstrate safe, clinical decision making by providing care for the presenting patient from initial history taking, clinical assessment, diagnosis, treatment and evaluation of their care.
- Will maintain knowledge of medical developments in primary care and ensure all new clinical guidelines are adhered to.
- Will support the practice with regular audits as required by NHS England and Bristol ICB for identified key practice developments, particularly in relation to long-term condition management and QOF aims.
- Work collaboratively and with the multi-disciplinary practice team to meet the needs of patients.
